Meet Heino Nowak

When we meet other Silver Griffins, we meet them at this point in their lives. We rarely know who they were in their '1st lives'! Thus, I have thought it might be of interest to share some of Heino, (so renamed after a group of 11-year-old girls fell into giggles when he told them his 'nickname' was Heini – for Heinrich) Nowak's back story. One of 8 children growing up in Austria & Germany, he pursued skiing as a given and trained in the hotel/restaurant business. While working as a bar tender in Casino Bad

Wiessee, GER, he met Ray Dietrich who ran the ski school at Craigmeur (NJ) Ski Area. It was 1965.



“Come to Craigmeur and teach skiing!” Heino did and cleverly identified himself as a ski mechanic, creating a new job category that qualified him to get a Green card. While working at Great Gorge (NJ) ski area, Heino became so dismayed at the quality, safety and appropriateness of the equipment that came in to be worked on, he decided to start his own ski shop. Heino’s Ski Parlour opened in 1976 in Pequannock, NJ. Some of his first boot stock was bought from Karl Pfeiffer, Ski School Director at Bromley when Karl retired as a sales rep for an Austrian manufacturer.

To support the business year-round, Heino added sail board merchandise. Subsequently, he, himself, became a wind surfing pioneer – teaching and plying the sport. He sold his shop in 1989. But the name and mantra of service and quality carried on. The shop known as Heino’s finally closed April 30, 2025.

Overriding his love for skiing and windsurfing was a love for tennis - not so much playing, but officiating. He worked for over 30 years as an umpire and evaluator for such events as the US Open and junior Olympics and, most rewarding, as coordinator and referee for the West Point Tennis program.

In 1980. Heino and his wife, Darlene, built a second home in Manchester, VT. For Bromley’s 75th birthday in 2019, Heino displayed many items from his Ski Museum which is housed at his home. Pico Mountain in Menden, VT offers **lift tickets for \$54** on Mondays, Thursdays and selected Fridays all season for VT and NH residents. Must be purchased online. **Killington** also offers reduced rates for VT/NH residents.
