Points & Positions to Ponder

Did you ever wonder how porcupines mate? Or what a newborn porcupine is called? Porcupines are one of the few mammals in



the Northeast that mate late in the year - Nov/Dec. Because they are well protected with quills, female porcupines have the upper hand when it comes to acquiescence. The male approaches the female and drenches her with a high velocity stream of urine from a considerable distance. If the female porcupine whines and shakes off the urine, the male gets the message and does not come any closer. If she is receptive,

the female will lift and arch her tail over her back. The under side of a porcupine's tail is covered with bristle-like hairs to aid in climbing, not quills, allowing the male to approach her without fear of getting stabbed. He then stands on his hind legs to mount her, holding on to her with his forepaws while mating proceeds. Next spring a single porcupette will, hopefully, be born. Well, now you know!
